Yak Tribe Kayak Shop Tournament Rules & Regulations

TROUT TURNOUT FORMAT



THE GOAL:

The purpose and goal of this tournament is to cultivate a friendly environment for kayak fishermen to compete geared around the Yak Tribe Kayak Shop events and gatherings. This tournament will take place the morning of the Yak Tribe party (Saturday) and end with the **SINGLE IN-SLOT TROUT** weigh in at the shop where winners will be announced. (Details on the trout weigh-in further down in this document.)

Please come to the Yak Tribe party. Win or lose - it will be good time! We will have **FREE** raffles, random giveaways, games, music, weigh-ins, and more. Bring your small charcoal grill and lawn chair and let's have an old school block party! We have always made an effort to not just be a social media page but a real community. Hope to see you there!

QUICK LOOK:

This tournament is all about speckled trout.

- This is a hybrid tournament. Meaning it is both a CPR (Catch photo release) and a weigh-in for 1 trout.
- Your 3 largest trout turned in on the Fishing Chaos App will go towards your overall length and total.
- You may bring in a total of **ONE** in-slot speckled trout to be weighed and added to your overall length. (This is similar to our "trash fish" division for those who fish our other style tournaments.) You **ARE** able to bring in and submit a trout that was entered as one of your CPR fish. <u>To be clear:</u> You **CAN** double dip and weigh-in a trout that was submitted as one of your top 3 trout in the Fishing Chaos App.

SECTION 1: IMPORTANT NOTICE:

It is YOUR responsibility to know the rules. Updates may come through the Fishing Chaos app and through your email so please be on the lookout leading up to the tournament. This tournament is **not** geared towards "professional kayak anglers." Please keep this in mind when competing and rubbing elbows with other anglers at our events. Unsportsmanlike conduct and talk **will not be tolerated** whatsoever both on and off the water. Unsportsmanlike conduct can potentially disqualify you from this tournament and any future tournaments or events Yak Tribe or Yak Tribe Kayak Shop holds.

SECTION 2: RULES & OVERVIEW

1. You must download and use the Fishing Chaos app to participate in this tournament. <u>DO NOT ADD FISH TO YOUR CATCH LOG</u> WHEN SUBMITTING FISH. Add them in the actual tournament dashboard on the Fishing Chaos app.

- 2. Participation is open to anyone 18 years of age or older.
- Yak Tribe tournaments will be held from first safe light until 1pm. (See fishing chaos app or email for exact launch time. Most tournaments will be starting at 6am or 6:30am depending on safe light and safe weather.
- 4. This is a hybrid tournament. All trout are CPR (Catch Photo Release) only. The only fish that may be turned in for the live weigh-in is a total of ONE in-slot trout to be measured. **DO NOT** bring in an undersized trout or trout that does not meet Florida regulations.
- 5. Safety is priority number one. During the tournament, all participants are required to comply with US Coast Guard regulations. All participants must always wear a PFD while competing in our tournament and on the water events and must be in possession of a sounding device such as a whistle as required by the Coast Guard.
- 6. In an effort to prohibit people from launching early, the first photo you submit in the fishing chaos app the morning of the tournament will be a photo of your kayak, your PFD / Life Jacket, and your identifier with the code written on it. All 3 items must be in the photo. The timestamp on the photo will automatically be marked when submitted on the app. If you fail to have your kayak, PFD, and your identifier in the photo at the launch your photo will be denied/rejected and you will have to return back to the launch to take an updated photo. All fish caught and submitted prior to an approved launch photo will be disqualified. Pro tip: After the code is released the morning of the tournament and you take your launch photo and submit it you do not have to stay and wait until your launch photo is approved if you are confident that you properly took the launch photo. We will call you if there is an issue.
- 7. You must fish within the boundaries given for the particular city the tournament is being held in. Boundaries will be released and posted on the Fishing Chaos app and on the Yak Tribe website. Everyone will be launching in a different location of their choosing as long as it is within the boundaries provided.
- 8. You may keep your in-slot trout that you bring to the weigh-in.
- 9. You DO NOT have to harvest or turn in trash fish to win this tournament.
- 10. You must be in line and at the Yak Tribe Kayak Shop by 2:30 with your trash fish to weigh-in if you are weighing in any trash fish.
- 11. Our slots do NOT reflect local regulations. Do not keep these fish. If you do, you are responsible for knowing and abiding by local regulations.
- 12. You must have a valid fishing license to fish this tournament.
- 13. The live leaderboard will be turned off between 9am and 10am.
- 14. You may only use a rod and reel to catch fish in this tournament. No bow hunting, cast netting, etc.
- 15. You may use live bait, dead bait, frozen bait, and artificial lures in this tournament.

- 16. You may not wade fish. You may step out of your kayak if you run aground so that you can get back to fishable water.
- 17. You may not launch multiple times in one day. You may only launch one time the morning of the tournament.
- 18. No shuttling your kayak. You are not permitted to launch in one area and be picked up in another area.
- 19. There will not be a captains meeting. We will have multiple live sessions and chats going on before the tournament that you are encouraged to join in on. Updates will be pushed out through the Fishing Chaos app and email.

SECTION 3: TOURNAMENT OUTLINE / FISH SLOTS & LENGTHS

- 20. This is a <u>hybrid tournament</u>. 3 of your fish will be submitted through the Fishing Chaos app and 1 in-slot speckled trout will be weighed at the Yak Tribe Kayak Shop.
- 21. **Submittable fish:** Spotted Sea Trout / Speckled Trout
- 22. You are able to submit a total of 3 trout via the Fishing Chaos app. There is no size regulation for the CPR portion of this tournament. You can turn in a 5" trout or you can turn in a 35" trout. You can turn in three 5" trout or three 35" trout and everything in between. We will accept your 3 biggest trout that you turn in. There is no size limit or slot. We are not following local regulations on slot sizes for the CPR (Catch Photo Release) portion of the tournament. Do not keep any trout that do not meet Florida fishing regulations.
 - 1. You are able to submit and upgrade bigger fish as you catch them throughout the day. If you submit 10 trout on the app during the tournament, we will pull your 3 biggest trout for your total length.
- 23. You may bring in a total of **ONE** in-slot speckled trout to be weighed and added to your overall length. (This is similar to our "trash fish" division for those who fish our other style tournaments.) You **ARE** able to bring in and submit a trout that was entered as one of your CPR fish. <u>To be clear:</u> You **CAN** double dip and weigh-in a trout that was submitted as one of your top 3 trout in the Fishing Chaos App. **Make sure that your in-slot trout that you bring in meets Florida fishing regulations. The trout you bring in to weigh must be between 15 and 19 inches. In Florida you can keep 1 over-slot trout but we will not weigh in any trout over 19 inches.**
 - 1. The reason we are not accepting any trout over 19" to be weighed is because we don't want to remove big trout from our waters on a mass scale.
- 24. If your 3 biggest CPR slot fish submitted total 48 inches in length and you weigh in a 2.49 pound speckled trout, your final total for the tournament will be 50.49".

HOW TO PROPERLY PHOTOGRAPH AND SUBMIT YOUR FISH



- 25. You must use a measuring board long enough to measure your fish without adding on any additional measuring devices. We recommend using a board at least 27 inches long. You may not use rulers, tape measures, or any other type of measuring devices to extend the length of your board if your board is too short.
- 26. Your identifier and code **MUST BE IN THE PHOTO.** At this time, your identifier will be released the morning of the tournament before launch. You may write the code on the back of your hand, on a piece of plastic, or on anything you see fit to use. Lay the code on the end of your board or on your lap. Just make sure it is in the photo. Your code and identifier may **NOT LAY ON THE FISH.** Previously we would mail out Yak Tribe tokens but for this series, we will have last minute fisherman signing up and want to allow everyone to participate.
- 27. The fishes mouth must be placed all the way up against the bump board as shown in the picture above. Do not allow any gaps between the fishes furthest most point. On some fish that may be the nose and on others that may be the mouth. Push your fish all the way up against the bump board to take your photo.
- 28. You may not **fully cover** any part of the fish. Do not cover the eyes. Do not cover the tail. Do not cover the mouth. Do not place your entire hand over the fish to hold it down. All of these rules are in place to make sure a fish has not been altered in any way either in person or digitally to increase or decrease the length of the fish.
 - 1. **Nothing** may be in the mouth of the fish. Do not have fish grips or lures in the mouth of your fish when submitting a photo.
 - You may hold your fish down using one hand if needed. DO NOT COVER THE ENTIRE
 FISH WITH YOUR HAND. If you do, the fish will be disqualified. Again, all of these rules
 are in place to make sure a fish has not been altered in any way either in person or
 digitally to increase or decrease the length of the fish.
 - 3. The entire fish must be in the photo.

- 4. Bungees or ropes are not permitted to hold your fish down to the board.
- 5. The tail must lay naturally on the board. Hard pinching the tail to make the fish longer is not permitted. Overly fanning out the tail to make the fish shorter is not permitted.
- 6. All submissions will be rounded down to the nearest quarter inch. Example: If you submit a fish that is 24.6", it will be rounded down to 24.5". It will not be rounded up to 24.75". The fish in the photo above was submitted and approved at 21.75" or 21 and 3/4 inches.
- 7. If you leave anything in the mouth of the fish such as a lure, or fish grips, or hook you will have 1 inch automatically deducted. We will not DQ the fish completely. If you overly pinch the tail of your fish to gain length or overly fan the fish tail to shorten the fish you will have 1 inch automatically deducted. We will not DQ the fish completely.
- 8. **Take multiple pictures**. Always. Better safe than sorry. If you feel you over-pinched a tail and a tournament director calls you, it's always best practice to have a backup photo just in case.

IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING VIOLATIONS: All final fish rulings will be subject to the tournament director's discretion and judgement. If caught cheating, not only will you be banned from all Yak Tribe and Yak Tribe partner tournaments, but law enforcement will be notified and charges will be pursued. We have zero tolerance for cheating, foul play, or mischievous behavior. All fish that are weighed in are subject to being cut open for inspection.

Acceptable Photos





Note: You can see one participant is holding the fish down with a finger. The participant did NOT cover the entire fish. We can see the top of the fish easily. Our suggestion is to NOT hold down the fish and keep your hands out of the photo if possible. However, this photo is acceptable.

SECTION 4: Questions and Answers

What type of vessel can I fish out of?

You may fish out of a kayak, inflatable kayak, kayak/paddle board hybrid, or SUP.

Can I fish out of my Hobie Lyxn or Jackson Blue Sky?

Yes.

Can I fish off of my stand up paddle board (SUP)?

Yes. Again, no motors. Your SUP's are welcome with us!

Can I use a trolling motor, Bixpy, or Torquedo on my kayak?

No. You may not use a motor in this tournament series.

Can I use live or artificial bait?

Yes. You can use both live bait and artificial bait in this tournament.

What happens if there is a tie?

If there is a tie, the person who caught the biggest fish will be placed higher. If there is still a tie between two people, we will move to the second biggest fish on their stringer.
